This book can help you and your child talk about God and life. It has things the entire family can do and talk about together. It will also help your child develop good behaviours.





Creation of Man (Genesis 2:7-9, 18-24)




God created Adam and Eve. They were the very first people. God made people in his image. This

Abraham and Isaac (Genesis 22:1-18)


God tested Abraham. He asked Abraham to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. Abraham was willing to obey God. God gave Abraham a ram

Isaac and Rebekah (Genesis 24:15-27, 62-67)




Abraham sent his servant to find a wife for his son Isaac. The servant prayed. He asked God to show him which woman to choose. God answered his prayer.


Joseph Sold into Slavery (Genesis 37:12-28)

God kept Joseph safe while he was in prison. He caused the prison quards to like him. God gave Joseph the ability to understand the




meaning of dreams. He had an opportunity to explain a dream for Pharaoh. Pharaoh was very pleased with Joseph. He put


Joseph's Brothers Come to Egypt (Genesis 45:1-15)







The Israelites left Egypt. Pharaoh and his army chased them. The Israelites were afraid. They cried out to God. Moses told them to not




be afraid. He said that God would help them. Moses stretched his arm towards the Red Sea. God sent a strong wind and divided the sea. The Israelites






Saul Tries to Kill David (1 Samuel 18:1-16)


David and Mephibosheth (2 Samuel 9:1-13)


Elijah (1 Kings 18:16-39)

Jonah (Jonah 1:1-17; 2:1-4,10; 3:1-10)



Daniel and three of his friends were taken from Jerusalem to Babylon. They served the king of Babylon. The king gave them nice




food and wine.

Daniel and the Lions' Den (Daniel 6:3-23)


